lowa communities faced significant challenges this year as we all navigated the COVID-19 pandemic, derecho response and recovery, and connecting with and serving others in new ways. These are moments when philanthropy shines by filling gaps, providing needed resources for nonprofit organizations and charitable causes, and leveraging additional resources for communities of all sizes. As community foundations find solutions for communities large and small, urban and rural – it is the collective work of these organizations that has the most profound impact.

In lowa alone, community foundations collectively raised and/or committed more than \$9.4 million to support local pandemic response efforts and then in August raised an additional \$2 million to support derecho recovery. The response in each area was based on each community's or county's specific needs. Community foundations went beyond financial support to help their communities adapt during this critical time by supporting nonprofits, schools, and small businesses through partnerships with public institutions in cities, states, and in cooperation with the federal government.

In many communities, these investments were made when participating County Endowment Fund Program counties deployed dollars through their annual competitive grant programs and, in some cases, through new emergency grant processes. The County Endowment Fund Program annually redistributes a percentage of commercial casinos' gaming tax revenues. Of that annual distribution, the recipients grant 75 percent directly to local nonprofits and charitable causes in their communities and the remaining 25 percent is added to each county's unrestricted endowment fund to provide a permanent source of funding for future projects and programs. Each county's endowment fund is intended to attract additional donations and provide a permanent source of funding to support county and community needs forever. It is these endowed funds that equip local leaders with charitable dollars to respond, when needed, to emergent challenges their communities face.

Since the County Endowment Fund Program began in 2004, over 30,500 grants have been made to invest over \$117 million across lowa. Alongside this investment, the Endow lowa tax credit program has leveraged over \$311 million in gifts to permanent endowed funds in lowa. Nationally accredited community foundations help administer both programs. These state-legislated programs are not just innovative here in lowa, but in the entire philanthropic field. Both have positioned lowa as a leader in community-based philanthropy and have also positioned lowa communities for success now and in the future.

In addition to the work of community foundations, regulated licensed casinos in lowa are required to contribute a portion of their revenues to area nonprofits and community projects. These grants are distributed by a nonprofit license holder, or Qualified Supporting Organization (QSO). These investments provide millions of dollars to fund projects in counties that do hold state-issued gaming licenses and beyond. A detail of casino grantmaking and County Endowment Fund Program grants for 2019-2020 are highlighted in this annual report.

We continue to express our gratitude to the legislators for their ongoing partnership and support for these programs, along with the Endow lowa tax credit program. We invite you to connect with and learn more about your local community foundation and the positive work they are doing to make your community a great place to live now and well into the future!



The County Endowment Fund Program (HF 2302)

The state of lowa is unique in that it has two legislated programs focused on increasing philanthropic activity to enhance the quality of life for lowans. Both programs, the Endow lowa Tax Credit program and the County Endowment Fund Program, are implemented through local community foundations.

Created in 2004, the County Endowment Fund Program (HF 2302) is funded by a percentage of the state's commercial gaming tax revenue. Initially, the amount was one half of one percent (0.5%) of the gaming tax revenue; this was increased to eight-tenths of one percent (0.8%) in 2006. These funds are distributed annually to participating community foundations and affiliate community foundations associated with counties without a state-issued gaming license.

What Is a Community Foundation?

Community foundations are tax-exempt, nonprofit organizations established to meet the current and future needs of local communities. They are trusted and valuable resources for individuals, families, businesses, nonprofit organizations, and professional advisors working to build local philanthropy, with a focus on creating endowments for the long-term benefit of charitable projects and programs.

Community foundations provide grant support for a broad range of community needs such as arts and culture, health, human services, and historic preservation. Because a community foundation carries the status of a publicly supported nonprofit, it also grows assets through contributions from many donors. A community foundation often has numerous funds as part of its total assets. Scholarship funds, agency endowment funds, and donor-advised funds all allow donors to make a charitable impact in the area of interest to them. Collectively, nearly 1,700 lowans volunteer their time and energy toward bettering their community through work with a community foundation in lowa.

An affiliate community foundation is a component of a community foundation which is a fund or collective of funds advised by a group of leaders in a specific geographic area. For example, there may be eight community leaders in XYZ County who advise grants from a charitable fund and rely on a "host" community foundation to be responsible for all of the administrative requirements of those charitable funds.

Most commonly in lowa, community foundations that have affiliate funds approach the administration of those funds similar to administering an entire community foundation, but as a component of the larger, host community foundation. These funds are then monitored by a local collective of people from the geographic area being served.

How County Endowment Funds are Used

The County Endowment Fund Program stipulates that the countywide community foundations that participate in the program distribute 75% of the annually allocated funds to charitable projects/programs within their counties. The remaining 25% is used to build the unrestricted endowment fund for that county to provide future grant support.

Community foundation grantmaking is done at the local level. Each county develops its grant distribution process and involves local citizens to review and allocate funding to charitable projects/programs that impact a broad range of a community's well-being. Because of this local involvement, grant awards vary from year to year, based on current and emerging needs. Each of the 84 counties that participated in this program submitted reports to the lowa Council of Foundations and the lowa Economic Development Authority. These reports outline the grant award recipients and provide additional information about each community foundation; the results are outlined on pages 8 – 49.








Statewide County Endowment Fund Program Grantmaking Statistics

The 15th year of the County Endowment Fund Program resulted in 1,923 grant awards totaling \$9,627,518.17 throughout lowa. These awards were made after careful review of applicants in each of the 84 counties. Collectively, the program generated 3,011 grant applications seeking funding of \$20,271,253.61 for a wide range of programs and projects.*

In their reports, the counties outlined grant award recipients using a common listing to categorize each grant as either program or capital based, with a particular focus on one of seven categories. The chart below serves as a summary for the grants outlined in each of the county reports.



\$4,081,340.72 | Human Services: public safety, recreation, youth development, social supports, etc. \$2,819,477.63 | Community/Public Benefit: community improvement/development, philanthropy/volunteerism, etc. \$1,071,600.17 | Education: schools – all ages, adult learning programs, etc. \$851,710.73 | Arts: museums, historic preservation, exhibits, etc.







Casinos' Nonprofit Organizations Provide Millions of Dollars in Grants Annually

Each of the 19 commercial casinos located in 15 lowa counties is required to share its license with a Qualified Sponsoring Organization (QSO). These QSOs receive a contractual percentage portion from their respective casino's gaming revenue to annually reinvest in numerous charitable and civic needs. Like many other businesses, unfortunately the Covid-19 pandemic has adversely affected casinos' to have less revenue available for grants this year – especially their being closed for 11 weeks to help curb the community spread.

They each operate with their own board of directors as an 'arms-length' decision making nonprofit entity. These QSO boards each establish the criteria that is best suited to their region for the types of grants they will consider funding; their primary areas of emphasis vary based on what will best benefit their areas. 2020 was certainly an impactful year that required new focus on what grants could be considered to help the most.

Thousands of grant applications are received each year requesting dollars for a diverse array of community and charitable causes. Considerable deliberation takes place by the respective board of directors to score these requests to then award millions of dollars to many worthwhile initiatives – in 2019 it resulted in 978+ grants totaling nearly \$106 million!

In the space allowed on each QSO's page, it would be difficult to list all their grants awarded. In addition to the normal annual grants listed above, MRHD has responded to emergency needs (for example \$150,000 Covid relief granted in October 2020), urgent economic development opportunities, (for example, air service guarantee to help secure improved air service) and major multi-year support of mega community projects, including grants to the City of Sioux City of \$1,000,000 each for recreational trails, the newly opened Siouxland Expo Center, and Missouri River riverfront development.




